Millennium Scholarship Updates

All high school students are reminded that eligibility for the Millennium Scholarship requires successful completion of 14 core units in addition to earning a cumulative 3.25 G.P.A. In addition to the G.P.A. and core course requirements, students must have been a resident of Nevada for at least two of the four high school years, pass all sections of the Nevada High School Proficiency test, and graduate from a Nevada high school. The 14 core units consist of four years of English, four years of mathematics (including Algebra II), three years of natural science, and three years of social science/history. Seniors: Don't Forget to Register for ACT/SAT

CCSD seniors are encouraged to register for the ACT/SAT if they have not done so already! These tests are required by most four-year colleges and universities for admission and placement purposes. Although colleges and universities generally accept either test, seniors are encouraged to take both tests, if possible. The ACT consists of four sections with an optional writing test. Cost for the ACT is \$32.00 plus an additional \$15.00 for students who take the optional writing test. For more information on the ACT or to register, visit www.actstudent.org.
